ELECTRONIC TRAVEL AUTHORIZATION	<p>NEW CANADIAN IMMIGRATION LAWS</p> <p>As of November 9th, 2016 all visa-exempt foreign nationals who fly to or transit through Canada will need an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA). Exceptions include U.S. citizens and travelers with a valid Canadian visa. Canadian citizens, including dual citizens, and Canadian permanent residents do not need to apply for an eTA.</p> <p>To apply you must have a valid passport, a credit card and an email address. It costs \$7 CAD and only takes a few minutes to apply. Approved eTAs are valid for 5 years or until your passport expires, whichever comes first.</p> <p>Click here to find out if you need an eTA.</p> <p>Click here to apply for an eTA.</p>								
INSURANCE	<p>The Host Federation, the LOC and the FIG will not be held responsible for any liabilities in case of accidents, illness, repatriation and the like. The FIG Technical Regulations foresee that all participating Federations are responsible for making their own arrangements to have the necessary valid insurance coverage against illness, accidents and for repatriation for all the members of their Delegation.</p> <p>The LOC will verify the insurance upon arrival of the delegation members (e.g. cover note or photocopy of the valid policy).
