## **GYMNASTS' DRAWING OF LOTS PROCEDURES**

We are pleased to hereby submit the procedures for the RG Individual gymnasts and Groups drawing of lots for the 34<sup>th</sup> FIG Rhythmic Gymnastics World Championship in Stuttgart (GER). This draw has been conducted in accordance with the FIG Technical Regulations, 2015 edition.

#### General principle:

Individual competitions and Group competitions:

- Random draws are carried out by computer for all phases of the competitions.

#### Individual Competitions – Qualifications (C-I)

Once all NF are assigned, the original draw is divided into four (4) groups of gymnasts (group A, B, C and D).

These four (4) groups of gymnasts are then divided into two (2) subgroups each.

As the qualifying competitions run alternatively, the starting order is determined as follows:

- 1. Gymnasts from the same NF perform alternatively at the same apparatus in accordance with the draw order
- 2. NF perform alternatively
- 3. The order of the groups of individual gymnasts changes for each day of C-I but the order of the gymnasts within the subgroups stays the same

1<sup>st</sup> day of competition:

- 1. Group of gymnasts A starts, followed by groups of gymnasts B, C and D
- 2. The first subgroup within each group of gymnasts starts, followed by the second subgroup

#### 2<sup>nd</sup> day of competition:

- 1. Group of gymnasts C starts, followed by groups of gymnasts D, A and B
- 2. The second subgroup within each group of gymnasts starts, followed by the first subgroup

3rd day of competition:

- 1. Group of gymnasts D will start, followed by Group of gymnasts C, B and A
- 2. The first subgroup within each group of gymnasts starts, followed by the second subgroup

4<sup>th</sup> day of competition:

- 1. Group of gymnasts B will start, followed by group of gymnasts A, D and C
- 2. The second subgroup within each group starts, followed by the first subgroup

In order to establish the Working order on the All-Around Final two (2) draws are carried out as follows:

1<sup>st</sup> phase of competition – Individual gymnasts ranked 13-24 of the Qualifications (C-I)

- To fulfill the starting order 1-12 of the 1<sup>st</sup> phase of the All-Around (C-II), a random draw is carried out by computer with the Individual gymnasts ranked 13-24 of the Qualifications (C-I)

2<sup>nd</sup> phase of competition – Individual gymnasts ranked 1-12 of the Qualifications (C-I)

- To fulfill the starting order 1-12 of the 2<sup>nd</sup> phase of the All-Around (C-II), a random draw is carried out by computer with the Individual gymnasts ranked 1-12 of the Qualifications (C-I)

#### Individuals - Apparatus Finals (C-III)

In order to establish the Working order on each apparatus, four (4) draws, one per apparatus, are carried out until the positions 1-8 are filled in each apparatus.

#### Group Competitions – General Competition (C-I)

Once all NF are assigned, the original draw is divided into two (2) groups of Groups (A and B).

As the General Competition runs alternatively, the starting order is determined as follows

- 1. Group A perform one exercise, then a rotation is made within the group for all Groups to perform the second exercise
- 2. Group B perform one exercise, then a rotation is made within the group for all Groups to perform the second exercise

#### Group Finals - Finals for the exercise using one and two types of apparatus (C-III)

In order to establish the Working order for each type of apparatus, two (2) draws, one per apparatus, are carried out until the positions 1-8 are filled in each apparatus.
