### C. Athlete Eligibility

ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY
<p>All athletes must comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force and only those athletes who have complied with the Olympic Charter may participate in the Youth Olympic Games. All NOCs, as well as candidates for NOC Universality Places and the host country, must have participated in their Junior Continental Championship (or any other continental qualifying event approved by the FIG). The gymnasts must have reached the minimum standards as defined in FIG 2014 YOG Rules and hold a valid FIG License until the end of the YOG 2014 Artistic Gymnastics competitions. Part D. of this document will prevail should these minimum standards not be achieved.</p> <p><u>Age eligibility to participate in the Youth Olympic Games:</u>                      Men: 16 - 17 years (born between 1 January 1997 and 31 December 1998)                      Women: 15 years (born between 1 January 1999 and 31 December 1999)</p> <p>Athletes who have participated in FIG senior competitions or multisport games (including continental championships and world cup events) may not participate in the Youth Olympic Games.</p>

**D. Qualification System**

**QUALIFICATION PATHWAY**

For each qualifying event, the qualification places obtained for the Youth Olympic Games will be allocated at the NOCs' discretion.

In the event of ties, the Olympic Games tie-breaking rules, as set in the FIG Technical Regulations, will apply.

The Junior Continental Championships or any other continental qualifying event approved by the FIG (strictly following the FIG Rules for Juniors) in the year of the YOG are used to qualify.

The exact dates and locations of the qualifying competitions will be decided by the FIG by the end of May 2013 and communicated to the NOCs.

The best ranked athletes at each qualification event will grant a quota place to their NOC, according to the following quotas and based on one (1) gymnast per NOC and per gender. These quotas include the Universality Places and the host country places:

In case the best ranked athletes have not reached the minimum standards as defined in FIG 2014 YOG Rules, the qualification places will first be allocated to the next best ranked NOCs from the same Continent having reached these standards. Should there still be additional quota places to fill, then these qualification places will be allocated to the NOCs from the same Continent which have not reached the minimum standards, in accordance with the ranking order.

In case a qualification place must be allocated to a different continent because of lack of participating NOCs, then this place will be allocated in order of priority as follows:

WAG: 1. Europe / 2. America / 3. Asia / 4. Africa / 5. Oceania

**HOST COUNTRY REPRESENTATION**

The host country will be represented with one (1) eligible male and one (1) eligible female gymnast (as mentioned above), provided that the host country has participated in the relevant men's and women's qualifying event.

The host country places will be allocated to the best ranked eligible gymnast of the respective Junior Continental qualification event by name.

In case the host country athletes have not reached the minimum standards as defined in FIG 2014 YOG Rules, the place will be allocated to the next best ranked NOC from the same Continent having reached these standards. If no other athletes have reached these standards, then the place will be allocated to the best ranked Host Country gymnast even if the minimum standards have not been reached

**UNIVERSALITY PLACES**

Candidates for Universality Places will have to participate in the relevant qualifying event. The gymnasts must reach the minimum standards defined by FIG and hold a valid FIG License until the end of the YOG 2014 Artistic Gymnastics competitions. The process to allocate the Universality Places either by name or at NOCs' discretion will be defined by the IOC at a later stage.

**E. Confirmation process for quota places**

**CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES (INCLUDING QUALIFICATION PLACES AND HOST COUNTRY PLACES)**

The FIG will inform the qualified NOCs immediately following the completion of each Junior Continental Championship (or any other continental qualifying event approved by FIG)

NOCs will have two weeks from the day of the email/letter to confirm that they will use the quota places obtained. After this deadline, unused quota places will be reallocated as per the procedure defined in section F of this qualification system.

In the event that the host country decides to withdraw its qualified male or female gymnast, the next eligible male or female gymnast from the host country, according to the results of the qualifying event, will obtain a quota place.

In the event that the host country decides not to use its men's or women's place, the next eligible NOC from the same continent, according to the results of the men or women's qualifying event, will obtain a quota place. In case this host country place must be reallocated to a different continent because of lack of participating NOCs, then this place will be reallocated in order of priority as follows:

MAG: 1. Europe / 2. Asia / 3. America / 4. Africa / 5. Oceania

WAG: 1. Europe / 2. America / 3. Asia / 4. Africa / 5. Oceania

**REALLOCATION OF UNUSED NOC UNIVERSALITY PLACES**

Any unused Universality Places, including those returned after the final allocation by the YOG Tripartite Commission, will be reallocated to the next eligible NOC from the same continent according to the results of the men or women's qualifying event.

In case this quota place must be reallocated to a different continent because of lack of participating NOCs, then this place will be reallocated in order of priority as follows:
