PARTICIPATION AND FIG LICENSE	Only junior gymnasts in good standing with the correct age and holding a valid FIG License until the end of the event may participate in the Youth Olympic Games Trial at 2018 Australian Gymnastics Championships. The Organizing Committee will be responsible for checking the validity of the gymnasts' licenses. No gymnasts will be accepted without a valid FIG License at the deadline of the Nominative Registration.

The non-reimbursable cost for the Entry Fee is of \$180 AUD per gymnast. This entry fee includes competition entry only. Late registrations are subject to fines as follows and are paid directly to Gymnastics Australia: Fine for missing or late Provisional registration \$300 AUD Fine for missing or late Nominative registration \$300 AUD

ACCREDITATION

Accreditations can be collected, by the Team Manager at the relevant Orientation Meeting.

Team Managers must have the following items:

- Insurances of all members of the delegation
- Competitors' music WAG & RG (USB)
- Proof for full payment of the costs due to the LOC
- · Licence of all gymnasts

At the Venue, Accreditation Checkpoints will be placed to limit access to operational areas to ensure the athletes, technical officials, volunteers and staff can operate to the highest possible level. Hisense will provide two Security Guards who will be located at the spectator entry to Hisense Arena.

COMPETITION FORMAT

The Youth Olympic Games Trial competition will be held in conjunction with Australian National Championships during the Junior Qualification competitions for MAG, WAG, RG and TRA.

The Youth Olympic Games Trial will run as per the Junior FIG requirements.

Men's Artistic Gymnastics Competition: Friday 25th May Eligibility:

- Athletes who are 16-17 years (born between 01.01.2001 and 31.12.2002)
- All athletes must have a current FIG license valid untill the end of the competition
- The number of athletes to compete for selection will be determined by their National Federation
- The gymnasts selected by their National Federation must participate on all apparatus

Judaes:

- All judges must have a current valid FIG brevet at the time of the event in thier respective discipline.
- D jury at each apparatus will comprise one Australian and one New Zealand FIG Category 1 or 2 brevet judge.
- E jury will comprise equal numbers of New Zealand and Australian judges, with minimum Category 3 brevet.
- One judges' panel will be formed
- The panel will consist of two (2) D judges and four (4) E judges
- If one or other Nation cannot supply sufficient judges, FIG neutral judges with the appropriate brevet category will be called.

Competition structure:

- All eligible athletes will be grouped in one group, maximum of nine athletes.
- The group will be judged by the YOG judges' panel at the same time as they are being judged by Australian panels for Australian Championships.

 At the completion of competition the rankings from the YOG Trial will be announced and the country of origin of the highest ranked athlete will hold the Youth Olympic Games Position.

Women's Artistic Gymnastics Competition: Friday 25th May Eligibility:

- Athletes who are 15 years (born between 01.01.2003 and 31.12.2003)
- All athletes must have a current FIG license valid until the end of the competition
- The number of athletes to compete for selection will be determined by their National Federation
- The gymnasts selected by their National Federation must participate on all apparatus

Judges:

- All judges must have a current valid FIG brevet at the time of the event in thier respective discipline.
- D jury at each apparatus will comprise one Australian and one New Zealand FIG Category 1 or 2 brevet judge.
- E jury will comprise equal numbers of New Zealand and Australian judges, with minimum Category 3 brevet.
- Two judges' panels will be formed
- Each panel will consist of two (2) D judges and four (4) E judges
- Each panel will judge two apparatus
- If either Nation cannot supply sufficient judges, FIG neutral judges with the appropriate brevet category will be called.

Competition structure:

- All eligible athletes will be in 1 or 2 groups groups of a maximum of eight athletes per group.
- These groups will be judged by the YOG judges' panels at the same time as they are being judged for Australian Championships.
- At the completion of competition the rankings from the YOG Trial will be announced and the country of origin of the highest ranked athlete will hold the Youth Olympic Games Position.

Rhythmic Gymnastics

Competition: Friday 1st June and Saturday 2nd June Eligibility:

- Athletes who are 15 years (born between 01.01.2003 and 31.12.2003)
- All athletes must have a current FIG license valid untill the end of the competition
- The number of athletes to compete for selection will be determined by their National Federation
- The gymnasts selected by their National Federation must participate on all apparatus

Judges:

- All judges must have a current valid FIG brevet at the time of the event in thier respective discipline RGI.
- D jury will comprise one Australian and one New Zealand FIG Category 1 or 2 brevet judge.
- E jury will comprise equal numbers of New Zealand and Australian judges, with minimum Category 3 brevet.
- **Difficulty Judges` Panel** (D): 4 judges, divided into 2 subgroups: 2 judges (D1 and D2) 2 judges (D3 and D4)
- Execution Judges` Panel (E): 6 judges, divided into 2 subgroups: 2

- judges (E1, E2): Evaluate Artistic faults 4 judges (E3, E4, E5, E6): Evaluate Technical faults
- If either Nation cannot supply sufficient judges, FIG neutral judges with the appropriate brevet category will be called.

Competition structure:

- All eligible athletes will be grouped in the general junior division
- The group will be judged by YOG judges at the same time as the group being judged by Australian panels for Australian Championship.
- The competition will run over 2 days: Hoop and Ball on Day 1 followed by Clubs and Ribbon on Day 2.
- At the completion of competition the rankings from the YOG Trial will be announced and the country of origin of the highest ranked athlete will hold the Youth Olympic Games Position.

Trampoline Gymnastics

Competition: Saturday 2nd June

Eligibility:

- Athletes who are 16-17 years (born between 01.01.2001 and 31.12.2002)
- All athletes must have a current FIG license valid untill the end of the competition
- The number of athletes to compete for selection will be determined by their National Federation

Judges:

- All judges must have a current valid FIG brevet at the time of the event in thier respective discipline
- CJP will be a Category 1 brevet judge from either NZL or AUS
- DD jury will comprise one Australian and one New Zealand FIG Category 1 or 2 brevet judge.
- E jury will comprise two Australian and two New Zealand FIG Category 1, 2 or 3 brevet judge.
- HD Jury E jury will comprise one Australian and one New Zealand FIG Category 1, 2 or 3 brevet judge.
- If either Nation cannot supply sufficient judges, FIG neutral judges with the appropriate brevet category will be called.

Competition structure:

- All eligible athletes will be grouped in the gender appropriate general junior division
- The group will be judged by YOG judges at the same time as the group being judged by Australian panels for Australian Championship results
- At the completion of competition the rankings from the YOG Trial will be announced and the country of origin of the highest ranked athlete will hold the Youth Olympic Games Position.
